Dear Whom it May Concern,

**Herewoode Academy – consultation regarding a change to the admissions policy for the academic year 2027-2028.**

When changes are proposed to admission arrangements, all admission authorities must consult on their admission arrangements that will apply for admission applications the following school year.

In accordance with the School Admissions Code 2021, admissions authorities must consult with:

- a) parents of children between the ages of two and eighteen;
- b) other persons in the relevant area who, in the opinion of the admission authority have an interest in the proposed admissions;
- c) all other admission authorities within the relevant area (except that primary schools need not consult secondary schools);
- d) whichever of the governing body and the local authority is not the admission authority;
- e) any adjoining neighbouring local authorities where the admission authority is the local authority;
- f) in the case of schools designated with a religious character, the body or person representing the religion or religious denomination.
- g) This consultation process allows concerns about the proposed changes to be raised. It is taking place for six weeks starting on Thursday 4th December 2025 and closing on Thursday 29th January 2026. At the end of the consultation period, decisions may be made based on the responses and the arrangements will be 'determined' by the Board of Trustees.
